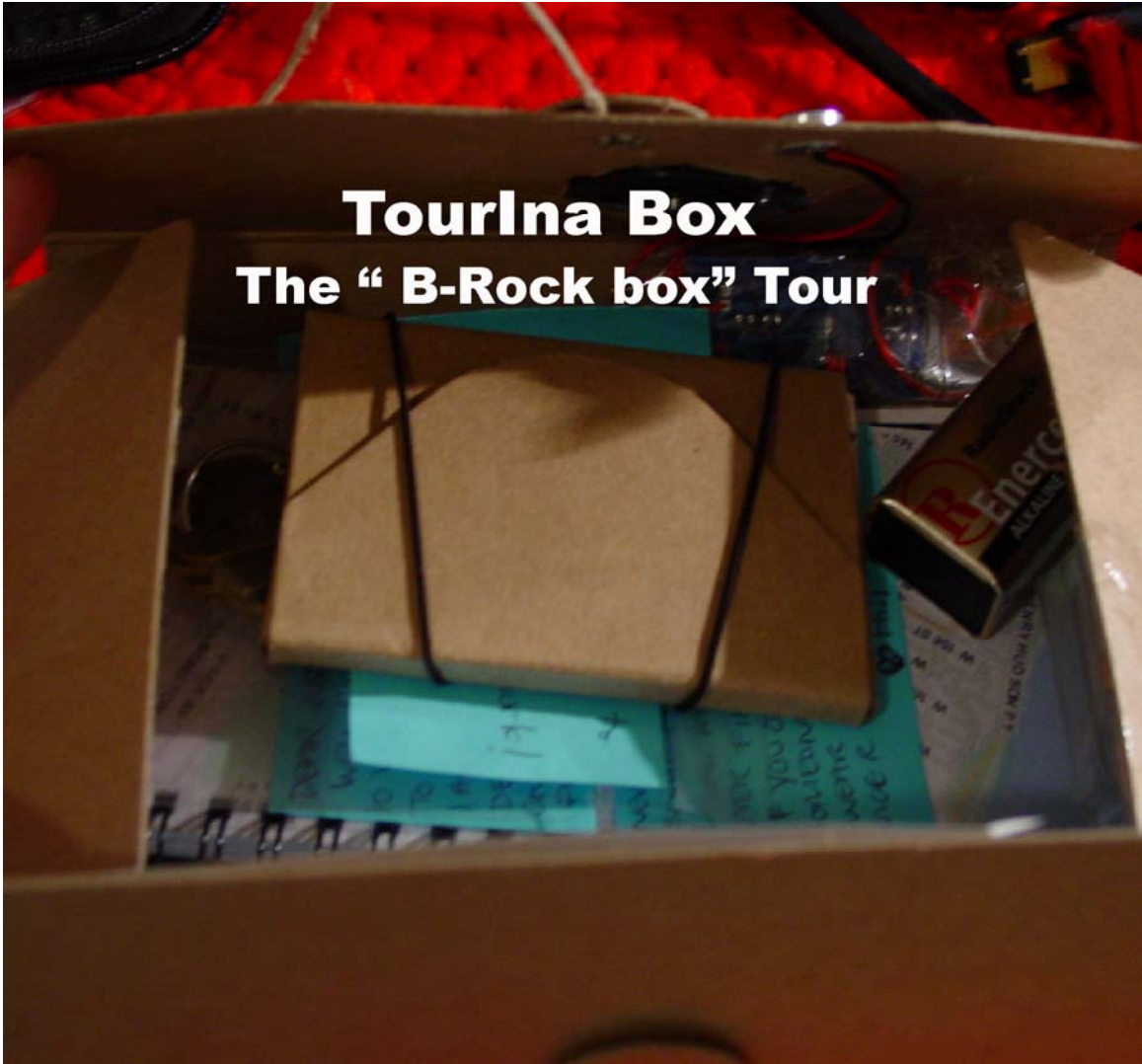
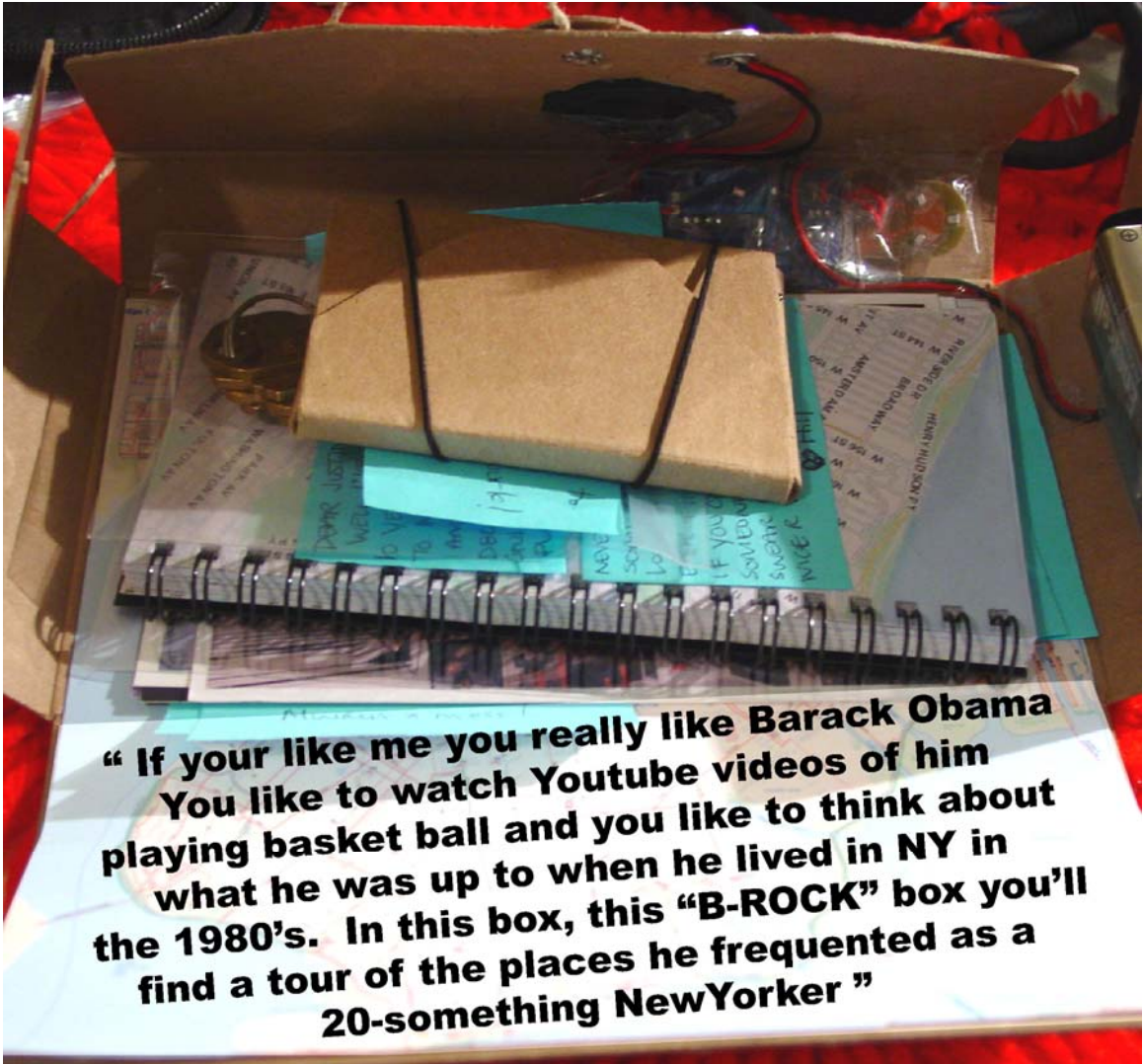


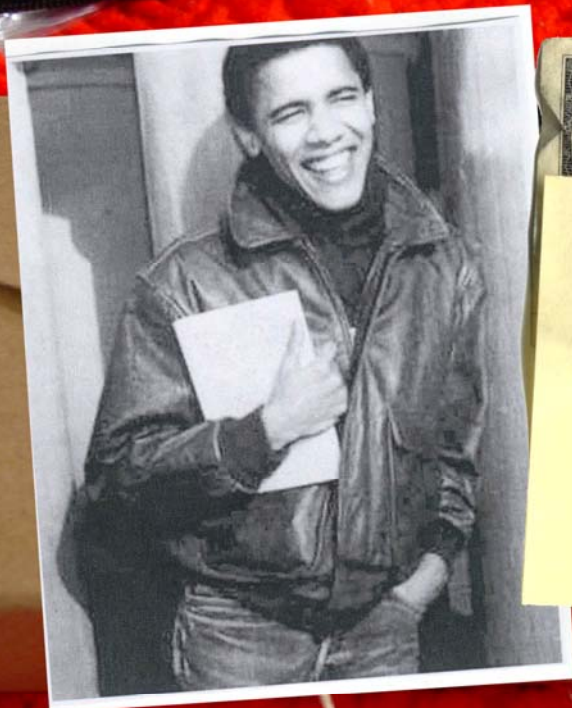

The "B-Rock box" Tour





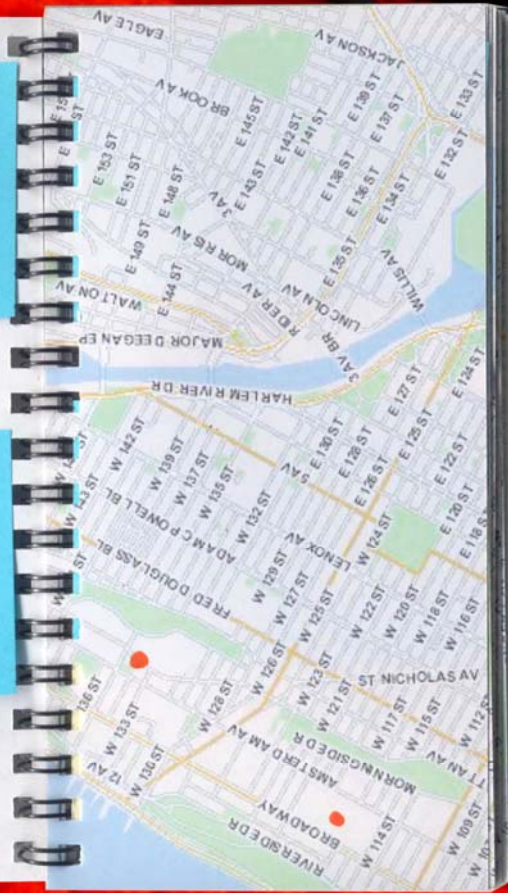
**“ If your like me you really like Barack Obama

dollar.

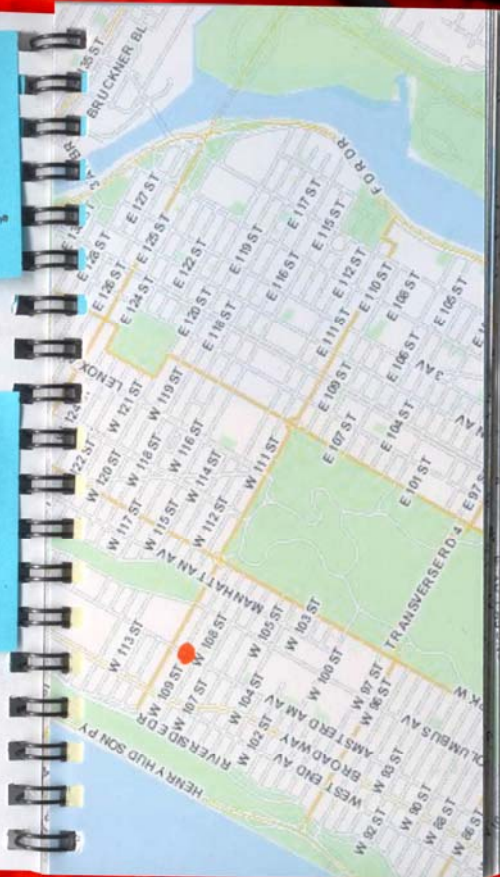

Keeping it clean, the next morning he bathed at a fire hydrant. [No BO for Bo.]

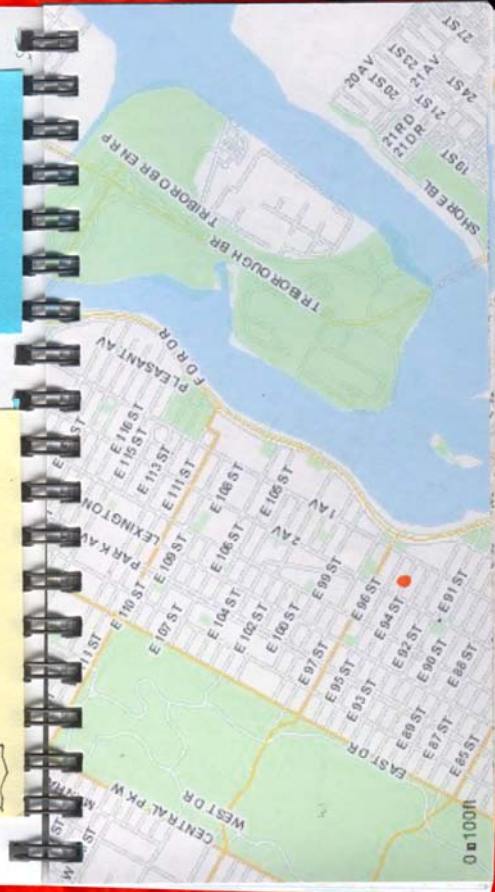


B-rock lived at 339

[Motherfucking poet, right?]

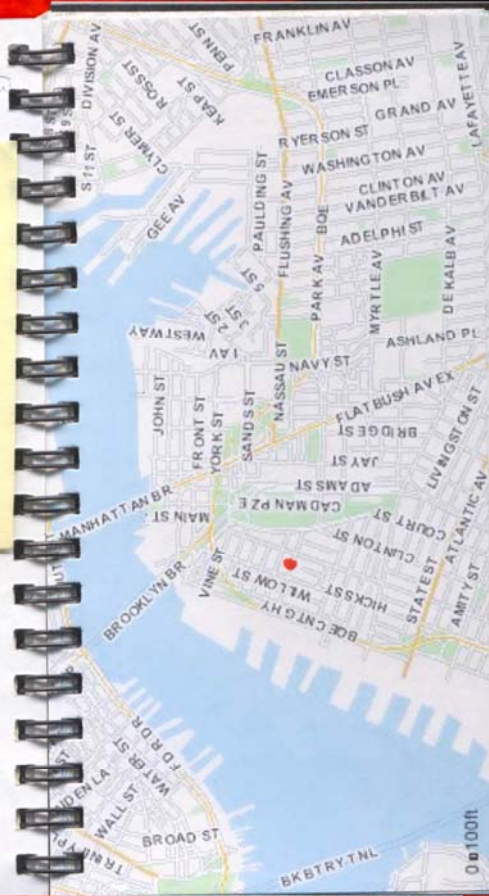


Out of college, Bain
